What an opportunity we have at Christmas to Make "Christmas" Lunch and spread fun and joy to children and families in our communities.

Here's a few ideas for some festive activities to get your creative juices flowing as you begin to think about your Christmas Make Lunch sessions!

Sparkly tree decorations

- Get hold of some sparkly pipe cleaners
- Wrap pipe cleaners tightly around a pencil or thin paintbrush to make spirals
 - Once you've made about 10 spirals lay them over a piece of wool or thread and tie them all together in the middle
 - Tweak and shape your pipe cleaners in different directions to make a fun shape
 - Tie the thread to make a loop so you can hang it on the tree

Paper snowmen

- Cut a white piece of A4 paper horizontally down the middle
- Fold one piece in half and then in half again
- Now draw a snowman- make sure his arms go all the way across to the edges of the paper on both sides
- Carefully cut out the outline of the snowman making sure you don't cut the folds at the arms
- Now open it out you should have four happy snowmen holding hands!
- Decorate each one however you like

Pom pom fun

- Why not make some super quick pom poms on your hands and then get creative! Click for a tutorial - <u>DIY Pom Poms</u>
- White pom poms make great indoor snowballs
- And can be stuck and decorated after to make pom pom snowmen
- Colourful ones make great Christmas decorations, why not add sequins or glitter for extra sparkle?

Game ideas

Christmas Relay

- Wrap up lots of empty boxes in funky Christmas paper.
- Divide participants into teams of equal numbers (at least 4 players in each team).
- Give each team a stack of Christmas boxes
- Its relay time!
- Split each team so they have equal numbers at either end of the room and place a chair in front of them.
- One person carries the stack to the other side and places it on the chair- the next person then picks it up and carries it back...keep going until everyone has had a turn
- Carry them carefully! If you drop any presents you have to go back to the chair and start your run again!
- First team back is the winner!
- If you need to make it harder for some teams why not add in some tube shape boxes or put some obstacles in their path!


Pin the red nose on Rudolph
